



**Ed Rozynski: Stryker**

Ed Rozynski has been a student of international health care systems for the past 30 years. His health policy advice has been sought by health care leaders, government officials and business executives in Europe, the U.S. and Asia seeking to compare and improve their respective health care systems, especially with respect to medical technology. In 2010, Ed was awarded the distinguished alumni award for UNC-G's business school for his life-long contributions for the advancement of global health care solutions and community service.

Ed has appeared before the US Senate and House to testify in favor of pediatric device legislation. Overseas, Ed is currently working with Beijing health officials on their city-wide pilot DRG bundled payment system. Prior to that, Mr. Rozynski has testified before the healthcare committee of the German Parliament when they were designing their new bundled payment (DRG) system. Mr. Rozynski is perhaps best known for his work with health care leaders in the Japanese health ministry whom he has visited on more than 100 trips to Japan. Mr. Rozynski has advised the Chinese government on technologies to remove HIV from their domestic blood supply. He also traveled to Phuket, Thailand after the 2005 tsunami to meet with local hospital officials.

In the United States, Mr. Rozynski worked with the Clinton Administration and the FDA to change U.S. law so that U.S. companies could export medical devices that had been approved by other major industrialized countries, but which had not yet been granted U.S. approval, thereby helping companies to maintain U.S.-based jobs, investments and exports.

In the early 1980s, Mr. Rozynski served in the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative and negotiated U.S. investment treaties with foreign governments seeking to stabilize and improve their investment climate.
